SEED ART

Materials:

- Assortment of seeds (different shapes, sizes, colors, etc.)
- Hard Surface (cardstock, matte board, foam board, cardboard etc.)
- Liquid Glue
- Glue Applicator (Q-tip, sponge, brush, etc.)
- Water
- Creativity



- Step 1: Sort your seeds by color and size so you know what you have to work with.
- Step 2: Come up with a creative design (flower, animal, etc.)
- Step 3: Draw your design onto your hard surface.
- Step 4: Glue seeds onto your design by dabbing glue onto your board over the traced design and carefully placing your seeds.
- Step 5: After your artwork is complete add a small amount of water to your left over glue and brush a coating of glue over your entire picture.
- Step 6: Allow it to dry thoroughly .
- Step 7: You are now ready to display your art.
